He is a prolific author with currently 16 titles on Amazon Kindle promoting freethought, science, and reason. For most of 2013, his *101 Lists for Atheists, Agnostics and Secular Humanists* was the number one Amazon bestseller under "Agnosticism" and on any given day, 7-10 of his titles were in the top twenty-five.

His second most popular title on Amazon is *The Statistical Theory of Everything (STE)*—which offers a unique alternative to the cliché "everything happens for a reason." The STE has proved to be an unexpected break-out favorite on Amazon—and its simple but profound message has resonated with many. American Atheists Take Playful Jab at Prayer in Super Bowl Billboard

American Atheists launched a new billboard near Metlife Stadium with a dig at prayer. It is believed to be the first-ever atheist-sponsored ad aimed at a Super Bowl audience. The billboard features a priest cradling a football with text reading, "A 'Hail Mary' only works in football. Enjoy the game!" The billboard ran through Super Bowl Sunday.

The billboard invited fans to visit the organization's National Convention website at atheists.org/convention2014.

"Prayer is superstition, plain and simple," said American Atheists President **David Silverman.** "It trivializes the dedication of the players and takes away from their achievements. A third of football fans pray in hopes of helping their team. These are adults we're talking about—people with children, people with careers, people who vote. It's 2014; it's time to stop believing that prayer works. Give credit where credit is due and celebrate what this is really about—coming together to cheer on hard-working athletes doing what they do best."

"During the Super Bowl, people of all religions and atheists come together as a community," said Managing Director **Amanda Knief.** "Like many in New Jersey, we at American Atheists are excited to be part of this event and with this billboard share our voice.

"This sense of community is a celebration of who we are and how we self-

identify, and that's the same environment we will create at the 2014 National Convention in Salt Lake City. Chris Kluwe, who will be our keynote speaker, is not only an athlete, activist, and writer, but also a nonbeliever. We invite atheists, fence-sitters.



and curious believers alike who think they know atheism to think again and join us this April to see what we're all about."



Rep. Rush Holt Reintroduces Darwin Day Resolution in Congress

the 205th birthday of Charles Darwin, celebrated around the world on February 12th as Darwin Day, U.S. Rep. Rush Holt (NJ) re-introduced a resolution "expressing support for the designation

of February 12 as Darwin Day." The American Humanist Association worked with Rep. Holt and his staff on H. Res. 467 (https://www.govtrack. us/congress/bills/113/hres467), also known as the Darwin Day resolution, and will be sending copies of Darwin Day Celebration, a booklet on celebrating Darwin Day and highlighting Darwin's contributions to science and humanity, to all 535 members of Congress to encourage support of the resolution.

"Charles Darwin is even more than the author of the theory of evolution, as great as that is," Rep. Holt said. "He represents a way of thinking, a philosophy, a methodology. It was his thirst for knowledge and his scientific approach to discovering new truths that enabled him to develop the theory of evolution. This lesson, about the value of scientific thinking, is almost as valuable as the theory he uncovered."

"We're pleased to join Rep. Holt again in support

of a Congressional resolution honoring Darwin's contributions to science and humanity," said Roy Speckhardt, executive director of the American Humanist Association. "Too many people are being influenced by the dangerous creationism and so-called 'intelligent design' movements, and it's time for others in Congress to stand up for true science."

Darwin Day is a project of the American Humanist Association and founded by Dr. Robert Stephens. The American Humanist Association maintains the official Darwin Day website at darwinday.org, where people can find Darwin Day events in their local area, educational resources on Charles Darwin and evolution, and learn about efforts to get Darwin Day recognized by local and state governments. The Secular Student Alliance, an allied organization, recently updated the Darwin Day Celebration booklet for distribution to college campuses.

The Darwin Day resolution was first introduced in the House of Representatives in 2011 by former Rep. Pete Stark of California, the first and only open atheist to serve in Congress. It was reintroduced by Rep. Holt in 2013.

In an article published on The Huffington Post (http://www.huffingtonpost. com/roy-speckhardt/on-darwin-day-we-honor-sc_b_4675215.html) Speckhardt wrote,"We need leadership from our elected representatives on this issue if America is finally to join the rest of the world in accepting the true origin of our species."

Charles Darwin's evolutionary discovery of natural selection as the basis for biological transformations responsible for the diversity of life on earth is the foundation of modern biology, genetics, and medicine. Other areas of science and the humanities can also trace advancements to Darwin's ideas. Since his publication On the Origin of Species in 1859, additional advances in knowledge have fine-tuned and repeatedly verified his insights.

The International Darwin Day Foundation (darwinday.org), founded by Dr. Robert Stephens in 1993, is a project of the American Humanist Association. Its mission is to promote the public education of Charles Darwin's theory of evolution and to encourage the celebration of science and humanity.



The Darwin Day resolution, which recognizes February 12th as Darwin Day, commends scientists for improving humanity's quality of life through scientific discovery, and opposes the teaching of creationism, has been reintroduced by Rep. Rush Holt of New Jersey.

Choice Challenge: 'National School Choice Week' Is Ending, But the Fight Against Vouchers Isn't Over

"National School Choice Week" may be winding down, but there is still much work to be done to ensure that your tax dollars aren't used to fund religious schools through voucher schemes.

You've heard a lot from Americans United this week (https://au.org/blogs/ wall-of-separation/national-school-choice-week-it-s-really-about-vouchers) about the truth behind "school choice." So by now you may be aware that this whole "School Choice Week" publicity stunt is really about vouchers, and vouchers aren't really about improving educational choices for anyone.

In reality, the only people who get to makes choices are the schools. They get to decide which students they will admit. They get to decide what to teach them. They get to decide who will teach there. They even get to decide if they want to impose theology onto students.

Unfortunately, it has become increasingly clear just how many schools that accept voucher students are using public funds to teach fundamentalist dogma. (http://www.slate.com/articles/health_and_science/science/2014/01/creation-ism_in_public_schools_mapped_where_tax_money_supports_alternatives. html) This week, *Slate* published a map showing the location of thousands of publicly funded schools in the United States that are permitted to teach creationism (http://www.slate.com/articles/health_and_science/science/2014/01/creationism (http://www.slate.com/articles/health_and_science/science/2014/01/creationism_in_public_schools_mapped_where_tax_money_supports_alternatives.html). Most of those schools get their taxpayer funds thanks to vouchers. Many of these schools are sectarian.

The map paints a bleak picture. At present, 13 states (Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Louisiana, Ohio, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Wisconsin) plus the District of Columbia have multiple schools running publicly funded creationist schemes.

(The biggest offenders are Tennessee and Louisiana. Both states have laws that allow creationism to be taught at any school, public or private, despite a

1987 Supreme Court ruling that barred creationist teachings from public institutions.)

As you can see, things are already pretty bad when it comes to public support of religious schools through vouchers. And the situation is likely to get worse. In 2013 alone, 15 states either expanded or created voucher or "neo-voucher" programs (https://au.org/church-state/october-2013-church-state/featured/the-great-voucherfraud) — systems of generous tax credits that are vouchers by another name. There is no reason to believe this trend won't continue in 2014 as misguided lawmakers and deep-pocketed voucher advocates work together to force their ideology on the public.

That's why Americans United needs your help, even after "National School Choice Week" comes to an end. There are so many schemes that pop up at any given time, we can't always find out about them on our own. That's why we need supporters of strong public education and church-state separation to remain alert and vigilant.

If you see something fishy, let us know. We oppose vouchers year round, and we'll work hard to make sure your tax dollars aren't used to fund religious education.

expression" by **Dora Guzman**, Graduate Student, Neuroscience Graduate Program, Emory University.

Genes are the molecular structures that serve as the basic blueprint in the production of proteins, which are the active biological molecules with diverse actions in cells. Mutations are permanent changes in the molecular sequence of a gene that may significantly alter the structure of the produced protein, possibly leading to changes in the protein's function. Scientists have recently discovered a process, called epigenetics, that can modify gene expression but does not alter the genetic sequence itself. It turns out that some epigenetic modifications can even be transferred to subsequent generations.

This presentation will focus on the emerging field of epigenetics, concentrating on recent findings in behavioral neuroscience. We may inherit more than just our genes from our parents. (http://www.meetup. com/AtlantaScienceTavern)


