### **Assertions on the Middle East**

Following is a series of assertions (numbered for the convenience of anyone who wants to comment, ask a question, or argue about any of them; these are not necessarily in any meaningful order). I present these as things I *think* are true, based on what I know now. I don't insist that all are indisputably true or that I necessarily have all the facts.


My purpose in doing this is just to write down where my views are right

now, so I can come back to them, revise them, or point others to them—and not to pretend to be wise or well informed about matters on which I'm not.

I am not Jewish or Muslim, Israeli, Palestinian, Arab, or in any sense a Middle Easterner. I am not religious—Christian, Jewish, Islamic, or

"spiritual," etc.

I've never set foot in the Middle East except for three or fours hours when I wandered around the port area in Port Said, Egypt, in 1966 (I think it was) when I was young, naive, and absurdly ill-informed. And the ship I came in on—a commercial tanker carrying grain to India—went through the Suez Canal thereafter and a month or so later came back through



it. (This was not long before war led Egypt to close the Suez Canal for 7 or 8 years.)

If you review these assertions of mine, you will not then know what should be done—I don't know and I'm not even hopeful. Some of these are probably contradictory to others of these—I don't claim to be consistent and coherent. As long as anyone is civil about it, I'm willing to entertain followup comments, questions, and argument.

Former President Jimmy Carter wrote, in his 2006 book (I'm reading it but nowhere near finished and I'm not yet persuaded that "Apartheid" in the title is reasonable), *Palestine: Peace not Apartheid*—

There are two interrelated obstacles to permanent peace in the Middle East:

- I Some Israelis believe they have the right to confiscate and colonize Palestinian land and try to justify the sustained subjugation and persecution of increasingly hopeless and aggravated Palestinians and;
- 2 Some Palestinians react by honoring suicide bombers as martyrs to be rewarded in heaven and consider the killing of Israelis as victories.
- 3 The murderous, barbaric, up close and personal, gleeful attacks by Hamas terrorists on Israelis on 7 October, killing 1400 and taking hundreds of hostages seem to be well

- documented, including by the terrorists themselves.
- 4 Benjamin Netanyahu and the current Israeli government have been quite wrong about many things, including regarding Palestinians—but have not even come close to doing things that justify the 7 October atrocities.
- 5 Accurate information of any kind in war time is hard to come by; great skepticism about it is warranted. In nations like Israel or the US, where there is an independent press, information is at least more likely to be trustworthy.
- 6 An example of untrustworthy information came when Israel was accused of bombing a hospital in Gaza and killing over 500 people there. The bombing turned out to be—according to multiple sources and reliable information—of a hospital parking lot, with the deaths and horrific injuries of far fewer people, and by a Hamas rocket gone astray, not by an Israeli targeting of a hospital. Not only was there grievously incorrect information put out—it was accepted without proper skepticism by governments all over that are unsympathetic to Israel.
- 7 Freedom of conscience/religious liberty for every individual human being is important and no perceived religious truth justifies denying individuals that freedom.
- 8 Freedom of conscience is at significantly greater risk in any theocratic or faith-based society. And this is so whether the religion in question is Christian, Muslim, or Jewish. It is certainly much more likely to be at risk in undemocratic nations.
- 8 I prefer to live in and support a society with liberal/Enlightenment values: equality for men and women, gay rights, civil rights for all racial or ethnic or religious or irreligious individuals, political equality regardless of wealth or income, and free expression. And I am unwilling to be completely tolerant and supportive of societies where intolerance is the official norm.
- 9 I am utterly unconvinced by any arguments about Israeli or Palestinian claims to the territory in dispute based on what God or Allah or Jehovah is supposed to have declared.
- 10 Who has occupied territory for more generations or by more people for more years or "originally" is not the basis of any persuasive claim to me.
- II Since the US sends a great deal of money to Israel for military use, the US bears significant responsibility for how it is used; Israel nevertheless bears ultimate responsibility and has ultimate right/duty to use it well.


- 12 Since Iran and other nations send a great deal of money to Hamas for military use, Iran and these other nations bear significant responsibility for how it is used; Hamas nevertheless bears ultimate responsibility and has ultimate right/duty to use it well.
- 13 Hamas should have used the many millions it has gotten in foreign aid more to provide for the needs and legitimate wants of the people of Gaza and less (none) for rockets and offensive weaponry.
- 14 It is not necessarily antisemitic to criticize **Netanyahu** and the Israeli government—but it can be.
- 15 Kidnapping people to use as hostages is an evil, immoral act of war.
- 16 For the relatives and friends of those killed, raped, or captured on 7 October, hatred and desire for revenge seem inevitable, whether wise or not.
- 17 For the relatives and friends of people, especially children, killed or maimed by bombing of Gaza, hatred and desire for revenge seem inevitable, whether wise or not.
- 18 Israel has a legitimate case for attempting to destroy Hamas, especially given the terrorism and official promise of more terrorism from Hamas against Israelis.
- 19 Those who declare that Israel may be creating more terrorists than they destroy by what the Israeli Defense Force is doing in Gaza have a point.
- 20 Those who declare that Israel should not bomb Gaza, killing civilians, in their pursuit of Hamas terrorists should suggest plausible alternatives.
- 21 No one should use inhumane weaponry like rockets armed with white phosphorus.
- 22 Israeli settlers in the West Bank should be effectively restrained by the government of Israel from appropriating Palestinian land or attacking Palestinians.
- 23 Dignity matters (see my earlier Letter on "Dignity"). Assaulting or undermining dignity, as Israel has to the Palestinians, is dangerous and unjust.
- 24 Trust matters. If Hamas attacked on 7 October with apparent detailed knowledge in advance of Israeli homes and events, no one should be surprised if Israelis are now more suspicious of Palestinians who live and work in Israel, whether or not the particular Palestinians are trustworthy. If Palestinian schools teach Palestinian children that hating Jews is righteous and necessary, no one should be surprised if Jewish Israelis are less trusting of Palestinians and more likely to harbor possibly unreasonable hatred and mistrust of all Palestinians.
- 25 Significant numbers and proportions of Israeli citizens and members of the Knesset (parliament) are not Jewish. Jews make up the majority of Israel's population at 73.5% (about 7 million individuals). The Arab community, spanning various religions excluding Judaism, accounts for 21% (around 2 million). An additional 5.5% (roughly 500,000 individuals) are classified as "others." There have been Arabs in the Knesset since the first elections to it in 1949.
- 26 Calling Israel no better than the Nazis in 1930s Germany is absurd, ahistorical, and antisemitic.
- 27 I don't know Jack Arthurton of Roswell, Georgia, but I agree with this from his letter to the editor in Sunday's (5 November) Atlanta Journal-Constitution—

If you are attacking American Jews or American Muslims, not only physically but verbally, you are evil.
